## Burning By-laws

Mid River Fire Department, like many of you, are thankful for this bit of moisture we have just received. It brings welcomed relief to a couple of very busy weeks of fire fighting. Extreme winds have caused intensely dry conditions. We would like to thank our volunteer fire fighters for their hard work and sacrifice of time, especially these past 10 days. Also, a big THANK YOU to everyone who turned out to help at the recent fire we had in town. Your help was needed and appreciated.

Here are a few of things to remember:

- burning barrels MUST have a screen on
- burning barrels must be 15 feet or more from combustible structures i.e.. houses, sheds, fences
- barrels should be set on non flammable bases i.e.. gravel, cement
- tall grass, weeds, etc. must be cleaned away from the barrel
- have a water source; either a charged hose or buckets AT THE BURN SITE!
- burning outside a burning barrel must be by permit
- do not burn on a windy day; should it become windy after burning has started, extinguish the fire immediately!

For those in the Village and area we appreciate it when you notify us that you are burning.

Even though it has rained, we urge extreme caution when burning as there are still large quantities of tall dry grass around. Remember the old saying, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." Thank you so much for all you do - please be careful!

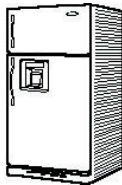
