

VILLAGE OF GLENWOOD

BY LAW NO. 6

A BYLAW RELATIVE TO Re: waste materials, manure, garbage, etc..

WHEREAS the accumulation of manure and garbage and waste materials and other refuse is a serious matter affecting both public health and sanitation, as well as being very unsightly, and demoralizing to public pride.

THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Glenwood enacts as follows:

1. That in each and every year, beginning with the year 1961, not later than June 15th, that all barn manure, garbage rubbish, etc. must be disposed of in a satisfactory manner to the Village officials.
2. That waste materials and decrepit buildings not in use shall be removed and cleaned up to the Officials approval.
3. Any person guilty of a breach of the provisions of this bylaw will have his premises cleared and cleaned and the cost shall create a special lien upon the land under the provisions of the said act.
