This year makes 100 years since the founding of Glenwood. To celebrate this event the Village of Glenwood and the Glenwood LDS Church are combining their celebrations to make one fun weekend. The Celebrations will be held on Friday, July 25th and Saturday, July 26th.

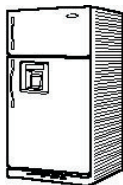
